Lucia Guzman is the Executive Director of the Agency for Human Rights and Community Relations in Denver, Colorado.** Since 1999 Guzman has owned and operated a popular neighborhood coffee house, Lucia's Casa de Cafe, and has represented west and northwest Denver on the Denver Public School's Board of Education. She was the first woman and first Mexican to serve as the Executive Director of the Colorado Council of Churches in 1994, where she coordinated community events and established herself as a champion of human rights.
