SANDRA M. SCHNEIDERS, IHM received her licentiate of sacred theology from the Institut Catholique de Paris, and her doctorate of sacred theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. After a distinguished teaching

career, she is now professor emerita of New Testament studies and Christian spirituality at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, California. Her many publications include a major trilogy on religious life and the book Jesus Risen in Our Midst: Essays on the Resurrection of Jesus in the Fourth Gospel (2014).

> MICHAEL PATELLA, OSB is professor of New Testament at Saint John's School of Theology and Seminary in Collegeville, Minnesota. He led the scholarly work behind The Saint John's Bible as chair of the Committee on Illumination
