Simone Campbell, a Sister of Social Service, has served as executive director of NETWORK since 2004. She is a religious leader, attorney, and poet with extensive experience in public policy and advocacy for systemic change. Campbell has been instrumental in organizing six cross-country **Nuns**

on the Bus trips, focused on economic justice, comprehensive immigration reform, voter turnout, bridging divides in politics and society, and mending the gaps in wealth and access in our nation. She has been featured in national and international media, including appearances on 60 Minutes, The Colbert Report, and The Daily Show with Jon Stewart. She is also the author of A Nun on the Bus: How All of Us Can Create Hope, Change, and Community.

Meghan J. Clark, PhD is associate professor of moral theology at St. John's University in NY. She is currently a senior fellow of the Vincentian Center for Church and Society and serves as a faculty expert for the Holy See's Mission to the United Nations. She is author of several books, and her research has been published in academic journals. Active in public theology, she is a columnist for US Catholic magazine and a contributor to America Magazine and Millennial Journal.
