

Five-Years-Out Survey <u>Class of 2013 Graduates</u> <u>Overall Summary</u>

In the spring of 2018, Saint Mary's College administered a survey to alumnae who had graduated five years ago (Spring 2013). These alumnae were first sent an invitation to participate in the online version of this survey. A print mailing was then sent to those alumnae without email addresses and/or those who did not respond to the initial email survey. Of the 346 total alumnae surveyed, 138 surveys were completed for a response rate of 39.9%.

Post-Undergraduate Education







4. To how many graduate or professional schools were you accepted?



This program was very clearly aimed at students going on to become practicing studio artists, and I have definitely been disappointed by how little preparation and post-grad assistance was allocated to helping those who want to work in creative fields, but not be a practicing, full time artist

I hope it is still being offered because it at least gave me an idea of what to expect once I graduated I wish that I had become a better writer. I passed my W course at SMC, but it was not without a struggle. I wish that there was a way I could have taken a writing class that was not graded or did not count against me at school. I wanted to become a better and more confident writer, but I hardly had the time and I could not afford to receive a bad grade (for lack of time because my major was so important to me). I think I would have done well if I had audited a writing class, but I am not sure if that would have been available nor am I sure I'd even had the time in addition to my own major. Nursing is pretty time intensive, but I had other interests that I could not pursue because my main goal was to succeed in nursing. There just wasn't time to pick up a minor unless I took classes during the summer... which costs so much extra that it wasn't worth it. I wish I had pursued more passions outside of nursing. I know nothing of art history and I also wanted to minor in philosophy. I guess I wanted to be a perpetual student! Must be why I am going back to graduate school!! I truly cherished my time at SMC, but I wish I could have done more as a student that would not have counted against me. My GPA was so important to me that I focused on nursing and did not explore other subjects out of fear that it would hurt my GPA or take away from my time as a nursing student.

I would have liked an internship/field study requirement as part of my senior comprehensive or as a condition to graduate
