

President's Medal


The President's Medal is presented rarely and exclusively to those who have offered exceptional contributions to the life of the College and society.

Kathryn Schneider has been a friend and partner with Saint Mary's College for over 30 years. As executive director of St. Margaret's House in South Bend—a day center that welcomes women and children who live in poverty—Schneider has been a role model to all of us in her extraordinary service. For decades, St. Margaret's House and the College have enjoyed a strong partnership, with students, faculty, and staff volunteering countless hours at the day center. Our students have witnessed how, under Schneider's leadership, women and children are more than clients: they become members of a supportive community that focuses on their strengths rather than their challenges. Schneider's commitment to social justice and her work to advance opportunities for women have influenced generations of Saint Mary's students to be positive change-makers in society. Besides collaborating with various departments at the College, Schneider has also worked with the Sisters of the Holy Cross. She has been a leader in the South Bend community to actively address issues of poverty. She was a founding board member of both St. Joseph County Bridges Out of Poverty and Stone Soup Community. Schneider earned both a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Divinity degree from the University of Notre Dame.



Mary L. Burke '85
Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa

ary Burke graduated from Saint Mary's College in 1985 and later earned an MBA I from the University of Chicago Booth School of Business. Burke's connections to Saint Mary's are deep: her mother, aunt, sister, and several cousins are all alumnae. Her strong bonds and profound love for this institution and for a Holy Cross education has made Burke one of the College's strongest advocates and most faithful servants. She has supported Saint Mary's on numerous levels, from her involvement with alumnae clubs and multiple boards—including the Belles Varsity Club and the Mother Pauline Society—culminating with her 16 years on the Board of Trustees. During that time, Burke served as Chair for nine years and Chair Emerita for two. She was also a tri-chair of the College's record-breaking Faith Always, Action Now capital campaign. For her exemplary contributions to her alma mater, the Board awarded her the prestigious Moreau Medal. She later received the President's Medal in 2016 and was honored by the Alumnae Association in 2020 with the Distinguished Alumna Award. Burke is a notable investment banker in Chicago and is partner and owner of Lakeshore Food Advisors. In addition to her devotion to Saint Mary's, Burke also serves on the Board of Trustees for the Shedd Aquarium, The Morton Arboretum, National Catholic Reporter, and is a member of The Chicago Network, an organization of Chicago's most influential women leaders.



M. Shawn Copeland, Ph.D.

Honorary Doctor of Humanities, Honoris Causa

Commencement Speaker

r. M. Shawn Copeland is professor emerita of systematic theology in the department of Theology and the program in African and African Diaspora Studies at Boston College. She also serves as Theologian-in-Residence at Saint Katharine Drexel Parish in Boston. Copeland taught theology at St. Norbert College, Yale University Divinity School, and Marquette University. She was a summer contributor to the Institute of Black Catholic Studies at Xavier University. The first African American and first African American woman to serve as president of the Catholic Theological Society of America, Copeland led the professional association for more than 1,000 Catholic theologians in the United States and Canada. Her areas of research include theological anthropology, discipleship, political theology, prophecy, and African American religious experience and culture. An award-winning author, she has written and/or co-edited eight books and 135 articles, book chapters, and reviews; she is also a sought-after international speaker. The Association of Catholic Colleges and Universities recognized Copeland in 2021 with the Monika Hellwig Award for outstanding contributions to Catholic intellectual life. In 2018, the Catholic Theological Society of America awarded her their highest honor for theological achievement, the John Courtney Murray Award. The Saint Mary's community has benefited from her intellectual work on several occasions, including her visit as the 2007 Madeleva Lecturer. Considered "one of the most influential, creative, and faithful Catholic theologians of our time," she leaves a remarkable influence on generations of theologians.

Formal Academic Regalia

The formal academic regalia worn by today's graduates and faculty have their origin in the clerical costumes of medieval Europe and have evolved into a great variety of patterns and styles. Late in the last century, American colleges and universities agreed to standardize their regalia; however, there is now a movement to return to individual designs for each institution.

The gown worn by those holding or receiving the bachelor's degree is plain black with pointed sleeves. The master's gown is characterized by a uniquely long, closed sleeve with a slit at the elbow, through which the arm protruded; this peculiarity is now being replaced by a sleeve more like that of a bachelor's. The doctoral gown has very full bell sleeves and is trimmed with velvet panels down the front and stripes across the sleeves.

The familiar mortarboard cap bears only a faint resemblance to its close relative, the clerical biretta. Some institutions now specify that a soft cap somewhat like a tam o'shanter is worn. The cap worn by those with a bachelor's degree is decorated with a black tassel or a color indicative of the area of study. Those earning a master's degree wear black tassels. Those earning a doctorate wear either black or metallic gold.

Most symbolic and informative of the regalia is the hood, which is no longer raised over the head but is hung down the back just as a cleric wore it when baring the head in church. The bachelor's hood is three feet long, the master's is three-and-one-half feet, and the doctoral's is four feet long with a rectangular panel which once served as a shoulder cape when the hood was raised. All of the hoods have a velvet border in the color of the degree according to the same system used for the trim of the doctoral gown (see below).

Other colors may be found on faculty hoods, although most hold a Ph.D. or doctorate of philosophy, so their hoods will have dark blue trim.

The colors and patterns of the satin lining of the hood identify the college or university conferring the degree; most prominent in the procession today is the light blue background and white chevron of Saint Mary's College.

Sister Madeleva's Walking Stick

The walking stick of Sister Madeleva Wolff, CSC serves as a reminder of the College's founders and sponsors, the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Cross. As one of the College's longest serving presidents, Sister Madeleva guided Saint Mary's to its status as the country's premiere Catholic liberal arts college for women, and it is appropriate that an artifact from her life serves as a link to the College's history.

Sister Madeleva associated walking sticks with the pilgrim's staff used to traverse the *Camino de Santiago* in Spain. So this walking stick also serves as a symbol of both the path our students will tread as they leave the College as pilgrims in life and the support they will need on the way.

Each new president chooses which, of the many walking sticks that Sister Madeleva collected over her life, is to be used during that president's tenure. The selected symbol leads the processions at academic ceremonies, much as a ceremonial mace does at other colleges. The stick used in the procession today is a brightly colored cane attributed to southern Mexico. It contains a series of carvings and paintings celebrating some of the cultures that melded over the years to create today's Mexico, including Aztec and Spanish images.


