All things housing - Dorm Rooms

Reunion guests can experience an authentic on-campus college experience by staying in a student dorm. Please note: Neither the rooms nor the bathrooms provide the same luxuries as a hotel room would be.

Staying in the on-campus dorms includes:

1. Staying near your classmates
2. All rooms will be furnished with **sheets, towels, and a blanket**. If you prefer the comforts of your own pillow, linens or towels, you are welcome to bring them. Please bring your own soap, shampoo.
3. Le Mans, Opus, and the hotels all have air conditioning. Should you be housed in McCandless there will be fans available at no extra charge.
4. Throughout the weekend you will be using communal bathrooms/showers, **we recommend you bring your own bathrobe and shoes to wear to and from the bathroom**. You may also want to bring your own larger towel and/or shower caddy for your supplies.

Other Accommodations

1. Nursing/breastfeeding mothers who need a place to store breastmilk, or those who need to store medication can use the communal fridges in the kitchens of each dorm (or the fridge in their own Opus kitchen). If this is not a suitable option for you, we recommend bringing your own cooler to fill with ice (available in ice machines in each dorm) that can be kept in your individual rooms. Note that there is a **limited** supply of small coolers at the front desk, you just need to ask upon your arrival if we still have one available.
2. If you require the use of a wheelchair during Reunion, please indicate this on your registration form. A limited number are available at the Le Mans Hall front desk.

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3. Alumnae with dietary restrictions should also indicate their needs on the registration form. **Vegetarian selections are available at all meals, with advance notice.** If you have made a special request, please notify your service when you arrive at the meal.
4. The use of **tobacco or tobacco-related products (including vaping) is prohibited on any Saint Mary's property including inside all vehicles.**

Registrations

1. **Price increases occur after May 1 and after May 20**—these impact both the package cost and the single events. The only group not impacted by price increases are the “Golden” (50 year) and “More Than Golden” alumnae. The only event that has a different price for the 5-year class is the Cocktail Reception.

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Other Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can male guests stay in the dorm during Reunion?
 - a. Yes! Any Reunion attendee who brings a male guest will be placed either in a room with a private bathroom or in a married housing section with a separate men's restroom. **This is a decision influenced by the number of male guests across ALL Reunion years, we cannot notify you ahead of time whether you will be in your class-assigned hallway or in a married housing section.**
2. What time zone is Saint Mary's in?
 - a. Easter Standard Time Zone, all activities and times listed on our website and in the programming are in EST.
3. Is childcare available during Reunion?
 - a. There are no campus-based activities or recreational facilities for children who might be attending Reunion.
4. What is the attire for Reunion?
 - a. Dress casually and comfortably! Friday evening events recommend a "snappy casual" look for women and a sport coat/collared shirt look for men. The Ring Out Ring True Campaign Launch Event requests Cocktail or Business Attire.
5. Is there a shuttle service from the South Bend airport?
 - a. We recommend using a Ride Share app (like Uber or Lyft) or catching a cab. Sunday there will be a shuttle from campus to the airport, and there will be a signup sheet at the front desk of Le Mans all weekend.
6. Can I purchase a ticket to the Notre Dame refreshment tent?
 - a. We do not sell any tickets to Notre Dame Reunion refreshment tents or events. There is usually a QR code to the full schedule and website for Notre Dame at the front desk of Le Mans.
7. Is there wifi on campus?
 - a. There is an open "guest network" available on campus, though service can be spotty. If you require internet access you might want to consider bringing your own internet hotspot.
8. I know the whereabouts of someone on our "Missing Classmates" list, what do I do?
 - a. Call or email the Office of Alumnae Relations with their current information!
9. How do I contact attendees from my class before or after Reunion?
 - a. Alumnae can activate an account on [The Bridge](#), which provides access to a free online directory. The directory allows you to look up contact information for your classmates who have made it available. You can also join your exclusive Class Group!
