



Institutional Research Update (March 2015)

This month's update covers enrollment trends by student (1) state of origin from Fall 2005 to Fall 2014 and (2) the identification of state and country of origin for Saint Mary's Students. Looking back ten years, overall headcount enrollment in Fall 2014 (1,519) is comparable to the enrollment in Fall 2005 (1,506). However, over the course of those ten years, there has been upward and downward shifts in overall enrollment. From Fall 2005 to Fall 2014, there has been an 8% decrease in enrollment of students from Indiana. Notably, Illinois and Michigan student enrollment has increased by 36% and 20% respectively, while Ohio student enrollment has decreased by approximately 35% over that same time period.




The map of the United States identifies the number of students of each state who were enrolled at Saint Mary's at the time of the Fall 2014 Census date. Forty (40) different states are represented by current undergraduate students. The Primary Market States of Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, and Ohio account for 70% of Fall 2014 enrollment. Additionally, these Primary Markets States annually represent 68% of total enrollment over the past ten (10) fall semesters. California, Pennsylvania, Florida, and Texas are also well represented.
