

EXPERIENCE

Your résumé needs to show both education and experience by the time you graduate. This is a very important year to gain a variety of experiences through internships, campus involvement and volunteering. These experiences will also help you explore careers to find out what kinds of opportunities you my want to pursue after graduation.

BUILD RELATIONSHIPS

It's hard to know what you want to do when there are so many options. Finding professionals in the field and interviewing them for information is a great way to find out what a day in the life is really like. Some professionals may even be willing to allow you to shadow them for a day to get a feel for what they do. Take advantage of who you know to find out what they do and how they may be able to help you.

INTERVIEW SKILLS

A polished and focused résumé will help you get an interview but the interview will get you the job. Interviewing is a skill that takes practice to perfect. Talk with the Career Crossings Office to find out what questions may be asked and what employers want to hear. Schedule a mock interview with the CCO.

GRADUATE/PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL

Career exploration includes finding out if your desired career requires an advanced degree. Your junior year is a good time to do some research and discuss graduate/professional school with the CCO and faculty within your areas of interest.
