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A Word from the Chair

I returned to campus in January after a busy sabbatical during the fall semester. Sabbatical is supposed to be a time to focus on scholarly work and to rest. To insure that I would receive a sabbatical, I proposed several

projects hoping that at least two of them would come to fruition. Well, all of them evolved so I was very involved in scholarly work during my sabbatical. I completed the internal evaluation for the Caregiver Connection Program with REAL Services and several partnering organizations in South Bend. This project was funded by the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Foundation with supporting funding from the Community Foundation of St. Joseph County. Total funding exceeded over \$3,000,000 for a three year period so the internal evaluation was intensive. In addition, I was invited by the Indiana

Department of Health to work with a nursing home training project in St. Joseph and Marion counties. In this project, we focused on assessing the impact of a training program for Indiana nursing homes to promote a better quality of care for the residents. Also, I continued my work in a rural central Indiana county to strengthen the services of the Council on Aging. These projects certainly gave me updated information to bring into my courses. This semester I added two new curriculum modules in the group practice course. One of these modules involves social work with faith communities in rural areas and the other involves pet assisted activities/

therapy in social work practice. I hope to bring a social worker to campus who uses pets in her or his practice. If any of you have suggestions, please let me know. It is always good to hear from you. Please keep in contact with us!

Visiting Professor Jennifer Bauwens-Byers

The Human Behavior in the Social Environment II class worked hard to plan for a South Bend Community Forum that is an assignment with the course. In preparation for the event, we had a three speakers come to our class to help the students develop the focus for the forum. Sister Veronique Wiedower, C.S.C., Vice –President of Mission for Saint Mary's College, was the first speaker to come to class. She highlighted Saint Mary's mission

statement and the mission of the Sisters of the Holy Cross. John Sovinski was the second speaker and he represented United Way 211, which is a calling center which helps to link individuals to the services. He emphasized the importance of supporting single parents. Finally, Peter Lombardo came from the Center for the Homeless where the students delved into experiential learning during the semester.

While the three speakers spoke about different topics, a common theme emerged. In order to make a difference in the world, social workers work through their relationships with clients. In order to work daily in stressful situations, they need to care for themselves as well as their clients. Thus, the

topic for the forum became learning ways to handle their own stress and anxiety. The class invited Dr. Catherine Pittman from the Saint Mary's Psychology Department to speak on the topic. Dr. Pittman does clinical work in the community and has written a book on the subject. During the forum, Dr. Pittman addressed specific cognitive and behavioral strategies to deal with anxiety and stress. While they may be needed, relying solely on medications to deal with stress carries risks because many of the drugs are addictive and have to be used with caution and under medical supervision.

Because of the importance of this topic, the forum was scheduled for two hours to allow time for questions and discussion. We were able to purchase lunch for those who attended through a grant from the Cross Currents Collegiate Speaker Series that is funded by the Lilly Endowment's Initiative to Promote Opportunities through Educational Collaborations. The students took different roles including making phones calls to get donations, helping to set up and clean up, and working on advertisement. We were happy to host this event for the South Bend community, and we were very happy to have students from Ivy Tech Community College at this event. Thanks to all the students for their work on this and also to Kathy Hammond.
