A Word from the Chair





As we prepare for the beautiful Christmas season, I hope that you, your families, and friends are doing well. The Department of Social Work has great news to share with all of you. We learned in June 2011 that the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE) accredited the Social Work Program for the next eight years! Therefore, the Social Work Program is accredited until 2019. Adding to this is the great news that we received no additional questions to address. The reaffirmation of our Program will have continued great benefits for the students, including the opportunity for advanced standing in graduate schools of Social Work, allowing them to complete their graduate Social Work education in one year instead of two years in many Social Work graduate programs, and allowing them to complete licensing requirements in many states. I want to thank all of you who have made this accreditation so successful

We want to report the very sad news of the deaths of Patricia McAndrews Pilger '54 on October 30, 2011, and Mary Osmanski Ferlic '70 on May 7, 2011. Mrs. Pilger was a founding member of the Social Work Program and the Social Work Program Advisory Board, and worked with us on our CSWE candidacy. She was truly a mentor to me before and after my arrival at Saint Mary's. She was always encouraging, caring, and kind to me. Mrs. Pilger was a role model for all of us to follow. Her support of the Social Work Program continues to be so strong as she mentored so many of us into the profession of Social Work. We will miss her dearly. Mary Ferlic will always be appreciated for all of her contributions to the Social Work Program. Both of these women have influenced the Social Work Program and have worked with so many students over the years. Our hearts and prayers go out to their families.

The majority of our senior Social Work majors are busy preparing their applications for admission to M.S.W. programs. Responding to student requests, the Social Work faculty has been writing reference letters to support their applications. We have hosted Social Work graduate school seminars on campus. The senior Social Work majors presented their community-based research on December 5th and December 7th on the Saint Mary's campus. Invited were the community agencies, as well as members from the Saint Mary's community. The seniors worked collaboratively in small groups to conduct their research. The Saint Mary's College Institutional Research Board approved these community-based research projects. This was a great accomplishment since the studies were designed and completed in one semester during the Social Work Research Methods class, which I continue to be privileged to teach. Congratulations, Seniors!

I have also had the privilege this semester to teach one of the four inaugural Critical Thinking Seminars on our campus. I have served for the third year as a First-Year Faculty Advisor in the First Year Studies Faculty Advising Program. As a Faculty Advisor to First-Year students, I am now teaching the Introduction to Social Work course as a Critical Thinking Seminar to twenty First-Year students. We have gone into the community as a class and dialogued with social workers in the field, including Erin Newsom '09, now working at REAL Services, Inc., and Abbey Carr Foster '06, working at Hope Ministries. These alumnae are doing such great work in our community and are great representatives of our Pro-

gram. Special appreciation to them as they continue to mentor students at Saint Mary's College.

Patricia McAndrews Pilger \$54

Pat Pilger passed away October 30, 2011, after a lengthy siege of cardiac and pulmonary difficulties. She is survived by her husband, Richard C. Pilger, Jr., professor emeritus of Chemistry at Saint Mary's College, her son, and three grandchildren. A daughter, Andrea Pilger, preceded Pat in death. After graduating from Saint Mary's in 1954 with a degree in Social Science, Pat earned a Master's in Social Work from Saint Louis University and then entered clinical practice. In 1964, Pat returned to South Bend with her husband, Dick, who came to Saint Mary's to teach Chemistry. After serving as a social worker for Catholic Social Service in South Bend, Pat began teaching Social Work at Saint Mary's on a part time basis in 1969. Appointed to the first full time position in Social Work at the College in 1971, Pat was one of the guiding hands in the development of the program that evolved into a separate degree in Social Work with full accreditation by the Council on Social Work Education. Pat, along with her husband Dick, retired from the Saint Mary's College faculty in 1998.

In 1999, Pat and Dick established the Patricia McAndrews Pilger Endowed Scholarship in Social Work as a tribute to their life's work at Saint Mary's and to the recently accredited Social Work program. At that time, Pat said: "The women who taught me were brilliant, and my faith was very deeply developed here. My Saint Mary's education has given me the courage to make decisions and to stand up for what I believe in." Pat's husband requested that contributions in her memory be made to the scholarship fund.

A Letter From Anne Therese Stroude '09, MSW

Currently I am volunteering as a cofounder and the program coordinator of a grass-roots community based organization called Lazarus Community in the most underprivileged district of Jinja, Uganda, East Africa. Lazarus Community is specifically committed to working with women. A significant percentage of Lazarus Community is either infected or affected by HIV/AIDS. Nearly 85% of Lazarus Community is elderly widowed grandmothers who are strained beyond their capability to provide for their grandchildren; the remaining 10-15% is single mothers. Lazarus Community is striving to implement sustainable income by generating activities to encourage self-support and provide the members with entrepreneurial, business, and practical skills. The founders are dedicated to alleviating impoverishment among its members by instructing the Lazarus Community members in the following areas: land management, proper harvesting, marketing, craft-making skills, proper animal rearing, and financial savings. We have three income-producing activities including our crafts program, garden project, and an animal rearing project. Presently, Lazarus Community is not receiving financial support from outside

assets: therefore, the founders and I are providing funding from out of pocket resources for things such as materials for crafts, small funding to assist with hospital bills, burial costs, and necessity items. As a growing dedicated organization, we appreciate any amount of support you are able to provide. I also continue to pray for further donations to help personally support my mission to work with the members of Lazarus Community; without sponsorship from family and friends I would not have been able to take on this volunteer position to follow my heart's calling.
