Notes from the Field: Sharon Mayer

The end of the 2007 Spring semester concludes another successful semester of Field Placement. Senior Social Work students have successfully completed their year of field experience. We had eleven students in diverse placements including hospitals, mental health, child welfare, elder care, and schools. Each of the students worked in their assigned placement at least sixteen hours a week and oftentimes gave extra hours. Students demonstrated their ability for flexibility and adjusted well to change. Taking on social work roles in their placements and adjusting to new environments in a professional manner were only part of the maturity these students presented in their placements. At their practicum placements, they practiced Social Work skills in interviewing, assessment and group settings with populations at risk. Their commitment to and interest in their placements were expressed through weekly documentation submitted for review. All have fulfilled the criteria at a generalist practice level to prepare them for admission to a Social Work Masters program. It was a pleasure for me to be part of the student's professional evolution. The students demonstrated responsibility and experience in their placements. It has been exciting to see them develop in their professional knowledge and presentation with their practicum experience. I look forward to another year of new Senior Social Work Students entering their field experience.
