Many of the junior Social Work majors in the Human Behavior and the Social Environment II class (SW 236) completed an Academic Experiential Learning opportunity at St. Margaret's House in South Bend through training and guidance provided by Kathryn Schneider, Executive

Director, Patricia Marvel, Assistant Director, and Sister Betty Smoyer, Guest Services Assistant. I received a Faculty Development and Indiana Connections Grant through the Saint Mary's College Cross Currents Program developed from a sustaining grant received by the Lilly Foundation to design and implement this learning opportunity for our students. This course

culminated in a Community Forum focusing on homelessness that was organized and implemented by Social Work students in the SW 236 class. The students did a stellar job at bringing the community together to dialogue on this issue. This spring break I had the pleasure of going to Honduras to complete a service project with nine Saint Mary's students. It was an eye opening experience for everyone in the group to see the poverty and poor living conditions of the Hondurans. We spent most of our time at a residential program for boys called El Hogar Diamante. The boys are at risk youth who spend most of their time on the streets panhandling and their parents do not have viable resources to provide for their children. I was so proud of the Saint Mary's students who went on the trip. These eight service students awakened at 6:30am to start the day. They worked with the demolition and reconstruction of El Hogar Diamante's pool. The pool was estimated to be over 50 years old. The payoff was playing and spending time with the boys of the hogar. The boys had such a great time developing a little brother-big sister bond with the Saint Mary's students. I believe the students will hold this memorable experience of Honduras for a lifetime. I would like to give Marc Belanger special thanks for all his work and dedication to both Field Practicum Coordinator - Leonard Sanchez the community of El Hogar Diamante and the students of Saint Mary's College.
