Melissa is also a Qualified Facilitator for the Global Competence Certificate, an intercultural awareness program offered by AFS. Melissa's passions are interculturalism and environmentalism and she loves integrating these topics into her theatre classes. She also teaches courses held under the ICS, Intercultural Studies, and ENVS, Environmental Studies, curriculums, As the advisor for EcoBelles, an SMC environmental club, she invites you to bring your hard-to-recycle items, such as damaged textiles, old shoes, and empty health and beauty containers to the SMC Costume Shop. Melissa is a proud member of IATSE Local 187, the world's premier stagehand's union, and was a former Secretary and Treasurer for the Local. Melissa is the grateful recipient of an IATSE Regional Costume Design Award, an ACTF Kennedy Center National Costume Design Award, and the Kelly Service Award, Saint Mary's College. Recent SMC costume design credits include Proof, 9 to 5, and A Party to Murder. Freelance design and technology credits include making touch samples for Fashion Redefined: Miyake, Kawakubo, Yamamoto Tour and stitching for various local films. In her free time, Melissa loves spoiling her many pets, golfing, kayaking, and volunteering at The History Museum.

**Michaela Duffy**, Professional Specialist, Theatre Production Designer and Technical Director, has served as a designer and technical director for Saint Mary's College for 16 years. Working with the Programs of Theatre and Dance and the Department of Music, she designs scenery, lighting, projection, and sound. She manages the student scene shop staff and production crews. She is the professor for technical theatre and design courses for the college. She works regionally with the Notre Dame Shakespeare

In 2007, she moved to South Bend to teach at Saint Mary's College Program in Dance and Clay High School Magnet for the Visual and Performing Arts. Michele's choreographic work at SMC includes Dance Ensemble Workshop concerts as well as *Chicago; 9 to 5 The Musical;* and *Hope Springs* with the Program in Theatre. **Sarah Noonan**, Associate Professor of English at Saint Mary's College in Notre Dame, Indiana, where she teaches courses in medieval and early modern English literature, book history, the digital humanities, and the history of the English language. She is the author of essays on manuscript studies, book history, medieval reading practices, devotional literature, and pedagogical practice, and she the founding principal investigator and Co-PI of the CLIR-funded project, "Peripheral Manuscripts: Digitizing Medieval Manuscript Collections in the Midwest." She has held research fellowships through the Folger Shakespeare Library, the Beinecke Library, the Huntington Library in coordination with Lincoln College, Oxford, and the American Philosophical Society. She is currently leading a group of faculty to launch a Digital and Public Humanities minor at Saint Mary's College in the fall of 2022.
