DIRECT ENTRY 4+1 SLP PROGRAM

This innovative program offers the chance to earn a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Speech Language Pathology within five years, streamlining the path to a rewarding career while saving one year of graduate tuition.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

In our Direct Entry 4+1 SLP Program, we nurture students through guided, supported learning experiences in both healthcare and education. With on-campus clinical opportunities available at our clinic, Early Childhood Development Center (ECDC), and the convent, students gain hands-on experiences that prepare them for versatile careers.

HOW IT WORKS

First three years

Complete six semesters of pre-professional requirements.

Bachelor's degree

Utilize graduate-level credits toward bachelor's degree – allowing students to use the graduate-level credit hours toward their bachelor's degree while retaining all the benefits of their undergraduate aid and scholarships.

Fourth year

Begin graduate-level classes while finishing bachelor's degree.

End of fourth year

Earn bachelor's degree, with just one year left as a full-time graduate student to complete the Master's degree in Speech Language Pathology as opposed to the two years the master's degree normally takes to complete.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

To embark on your journey towards an 4+1 degree in Speech Language Pathology, follow these steps:

- Apply to the College by January 15.
- List Speech Language Pathology as a preferred major.
- Full matriculation into the Master's program requires:
 - Overall SMC GPA of 3.0+.
 - Overall SLP major GPA of 3.25 (including Intro to Communicative Disorders, Anatomy and Physiology of the Speech and Hearing Mechanisms, Phonetics, Language Development and Speech and Hearing Sciences).
 - Pass a criminal background check.
